May 25



Morning - Visit the **Giant's Causeway**, recognised as one of the natural wonders of the world and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It consists of thousands of hexagonally-shaped basalt columns, some up to 160 meters high, formed 60 million years ago from volcanic lava. The sense of geological violence is palpable in the place, and standing among the towering tubes of stone makes the ancient myth of the giant's pathway to Scotland seem highly probable. Ensure to watch the AV presentation.

Continue along the Causeway Coastal Route to the Walled City of Derry.

Arrive in The Walled City of Derry - the only completely walled city in Ireland. The city is called Londonderry and Derry. Its historic core is shaped by winding streets, and the tour of the ancient walls of the old town will offer amazing views out over the city.

Afternoon - Guided Walking Tour of the 17th Century Derry City Walls & St Columb's Cathedral - Built between 1614 and 1619, these original Walls are almost perfectly preserved today, making Derry one of the finest examples of a Walled City in Europe.





Visit the newly opened Museum of Free Derry and Murals in the Bogside, including the famous "Free Derry Corner". Discover the people's story of the struggle for Civil Rights, the Battle of the Bogside and Bloody Sunday.

Evening – Sample some of the fine music, food and traditional dancing of one of Ireland's finest cities.

Enjoy a **Foyle River Cruise** and find out more about the US Navy stationed here during WWII.

May 26

Morning - Depart Derry and head for Co. Fermanagh.

Visit **Gray's Printing Press** a National Trust Property. Behind its elegant façade is the fascinating story of ink, galleys, presses and emigration, as this is where John Dunlap, printer of the American Declaration of Independence, and James Wilson, grandfather of President Woodrow Wilson, learned their trade.

Depart Strabane and travel to Omagh.

Lunch (Mellon Country Inn)

Afternoon - Visit the **Ulster American Folk Park**, which tells the story of emigration during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. The Old and New World layout of the Park illustrates the various aspects of emigrant life on both sides of the Atlantic.
