Take the scenic ferry ride from Cobh and get captured in the history and mystery of this magical island.

Waterford contains Ireland's only Medieval Museum, a stunning modern building that incorporates a 13th century Choristers' Hall and a 15th century wine vault. Within a few metres of the medieval museum is the Bishop's Palace Museum built in 1743 it is here that the story of Waterford from 1700 to the 1970s is told by reenactors against a backdrop of rare 18th century Irish furniture, glass silver and paintings. These two museums form part of the Waterford Treasures – a collection of museums within Waterford's Viking Triangle

Depart for Kilkenny and visit Jerpoint Abbey and Jerpoint Park.

Jerpoint Abbey is an outstanding example of the remains of a 12th century Cistercian Abbey. Nearby Jerpoint Park offers the unique opportunity of seeing the footprints of a deserted 12th century medieval town, including the tomb effigy of St Nicholas of Myra. As Jerpoint Park is also a working farm, you will also see a sheep dog demonstration here.
